P: On Christmas morning it is wholly appropriate that we acknowledge that it was because of our sin that Jesus "emptied Himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death,

C: even death on a cross!"

SCRIPTURE READINGS

Isaiah 52:7-10

How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him who brings good news, who publishes peace, who brings good news of happiness, who publishes salvation, who says to Zion, “Your God reigns.”

⁸The voice of your watchmen — they lift up their voice; together they sing for joy; for eye to eye they see the return of the LORD to Zion. ⁹Break forth together into singing, you waste places of Jerusalem, for the LORD has comforted his people; he has redeemed Jerusalem.

¹⁰The LORD has bared his holy arm before the eyes of all the nations, and all the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God.

Hebrews 1:1-12

Long ago, at many times and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the prophets, ²but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed the heir of all things, through whom also he created the world. ³He is the radiance of the glory of God and the exact imprint of his nature, and he upholds the universe by the word of his power. After making purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, ⁴having become as much superior to angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs. ⁵For to which of the angels did God ever say, “You are my Son, today I have begotten you”?

Or again, “I will be to him a father, and he shall be to me a son”? ⁶And again, when he brings the firstborn into the world, he says, “Let all God’s angels worship him.” ⁷Of the angels he says, “He makes his angels winds, and his ministers a flame of fire.”

But you are the same, and your years will have no end.”

John 1:1-14

PRAYER OF THE CHURCH

P: The Christmas season is, sadly, a time we often neglect to pray.

**C: We become too busy, too distracted by the glitter,
and too focused on ourselves to lift up our hearts to the Lord.**

P: On this holy day it is good and proper for us to include in our celebration of Christ’s birth petitions for our families, our neighbors, and our world.

Men: We need to pray for those who are homeless, hungry, or living in poverty.

P: Father, look with mercy upon those who have little to nothing in their lives. Provide the homeless with safety and shelter. Open Your gracious hand to feed those who hunger. Grant the poor their daily needs. Make Your people a compassionate extension of Your ministry and care for the world – seeing the needs of those around us and responding with mercy;

C: through Jesus Christ, our Lord, amen.

Women: We need to pray for those who are mourning, alone, or brokenhearted.

P: Jesus, look with mercy upon those whose hearts and souls are hurting. Comfort, with the hope of the resurrection, those who mourn the death of friends and family. Remind all who find themselves alone that You are ever-present with Your love and care. Bind up the hearts of those wounded and shattered by this world. Put the words of Your forgiveness, life, and salvation on the lips of Your people – that we, in turn, may bring healing and restoration into the lives of the hurting;

C: through Your name, amen.

Men: We need to pray for those who are living in the chains of addiction.

P: Spirit, look with mercy upon those who bound by the demons of addiction. By Your gracious power, free them from that which is destroying them. Pull them out of their shame and freely forgive them their sins. Restore their health, their minds, and their relationships. Help us to be a people ready to step in to help, to reconcile, and to restore;

C: through Jesus Christ, our Lord, amen.

Women: We need to pray for those who serve in positions of authority in our country and all nations.

P: Father, guide all those whom You have placed in positions of authority to be Your worthy servants for the sake of their people. Give us times of peace and stability. Grant us leaders who will strive to be like You and to heed Your holy will. Govern our present days, as You have the past, to bring Your plan of salvation to the world. Help Your people to be good citizens and neighbors wherever they may dwell;

C: through Jesus Christ, our Lord, amen.

Men: We need to pray for those who struggle with mental illness and depression.

P: Jesus, You were born into this world of struggle and brokenness. Bring healing to the minds and souls of those battling mental illness. Give them strength for the facing of this day and every day, confident that You have not and never shall abandon them. Restore and sustain joy in the hearts of those dealing with depression. Let Your redeemed people share the message that our salvation is secure because of You and Your actions and is not based on how we feel;

C: through Your name, amen.

Women: We need to pray for all of our brothers and sisters in the faith who are imprisoned, suffering, or persecuted.

P: Spirit, look with mercy upon those Christians who are suffering because of their faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. Give them both the strength to stand up under the pressure and the heart to love their enemies. Move the hearts of those persecuting the Church that, like Paul long ago, they might come to the knowledge of the truth and be saved. Open the eyes of Your people who dwell in physical safety to be aware of our persecuted brothers and sisters in the faith and defend them via prayer and advocacy;

C: through Jesus Christ, our Lord, amen.

Men: We need to pray for those who are living in the darkness of unbelief.

P: Jesus, You were born to be the Light of the world. Shine upon all those living in darkness and unbelief. We especially pray for those members of own families who have not yet believed in You. Replace their hearts of stone with hearts of flesh and let Your word dwell within them richly. Help us to be both bold and gentle as we share the Good News of salvation with whomever You place in our path;

C: through Your name, amen.

Women: We need to pray for all of our families.

P: Spirit, look with mercy upon all of our families and marriages. Bless our homes to be safe havens and places filled with mutual love and joy. Move all husbands to love their wives as Christ loved the Church, and all wives to respect their husbands as we honor Jesus. Help us to teach our children the true fear, knowledge, and love of the Lord. May our families be built on the Rock, which is Christ the Lord;

C: through Jesus Christ, our Lord, amen.

P: Let us close our petitions this Christmas Day with a prayer so simple that small children easily learn it, and yet a prayer also so rich that we should daily attend to it and learn it anew. Today we sing the prayer given to us by Jesus Christ:

Our Fa-ther in heav-en, all praise to Your name!
