Bethlehem Lutheran Church, Hermiston, Oregon

The Lord be with you! The Lord's Supper is celebrated this morning in the confidence that, as He says, Jesus gives us not only bread and wine, but also His very body and blood to eat and drink (Matthew 26:26-28). This meal is given to us for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Christ and our love for one another.

Because the Scriptures tell us that those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood in an unworthy manner are doing themselves great harm (1 Corinthians 11:27-29); and because Holy Communion is a sharing in the faith confessed at this altar, the following are asked to consult with the pastor before taking communion:

- any who are not yet instructed in the Christian faith;
- those who hold a confession differing from that of Bethlehem, Christ Alone, and the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod.

If you are visiting us this morning and would like to receive a blessing at the altar, we invite you to come forward. To let those serving communion know you would like to receive a blessing, please cross your arms across your chest and bow your head – see image to the right.

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Lighting the Advent Wreath

Family: Today we stroll down the dark streets of the little town of Bethlehem, where shines the everlasting Light.

C: It is a tiny town with an ironic history of fathering great kings.

Family: Bring your hopes and your fears as you walk these streets –

Family: For we are promised that the King born in Bethlehem, Jesus Christ, will answer them in a most unexpected manner.

C: Today we light The Bethlehem Candle

Family: The Prophet Micah wrote:

“But you, Bethlehem, though you are small among the clans of Judah,
out of you will come for Me One Who will be ruler over Israel,
Whose origins are from of old, from ancient times.”

P: Let us pray . . . Father, we are in awe of Your love – for it was Your love that sent Your only Son into our world. Through His humble birth in Bethlehem You demonstrated Your care and salvation for all the small and the broken and the humble . . . in Jesus’ name. Amen.

The second candle is lit as the Congregation sings, a capella, vv. 4-5 of “O Come, O Come, Emmanuel”

O come, Thou Branch of Jesse’s tree,
Free them from Satan’s tyranny
That trust Thy mighty pow’r to save,
And give them vict’ry o’er the grave.

REFRAIN: Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel Shall come to thee, O Israel!

O come, Thou Key of David, come,
And open wide our heav’nly home;
Make safe the way that leads on high,
And close the path to misery. **REFRAIN**

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P: Lord, may the light of this second candle, as it dispels the darkness around it, help to remind us that You have dispelled the darkness of death and sin in the world and in our lives and declared us to be the light of the world.

C: Help us we pray to be Your faithful light to the lost. In Jesus’ name, Amen.

Isaiah 11:1-10

There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse, and a branch from his roots shall bear fruit. ²And the Spirit of the LORD shall rest upon him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the LORD. ³And his delight shall be in the fear of the LORD.

He shall not judge by what his eyes see, or decide disputes by what his ears hear, ⁴but with righteousness he shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth; and he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked.

Romans 15:4-13

Matthew 3:1-12

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the third chapter.

C: Glory to You, O Lord.

In those days John the Baptist came preaching in the wilderness of Judea, ²"Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

³For this is he who was spoken of by the prophet Isaiah when he said,

"The voice of one crying in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord; make his paths straight.'"

⁴Now John wore a garment of camel's hair and a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey.

⁵Then Jerusalem and all Judea and all the region about the Jordan were going out to him, ⁶and they were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins.

⁷But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? ⁸Bear fruit in keeping with repentance. ⁹And do not presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father,' for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children for Abraham. ¹⁰Even now the axe is laid to the root of the trees. Every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.

¹¹"I baptize you with water for repentance, but he who is coming after me is mightier than I, whose sandals I am not worthy to carry. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire. ¹²His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor and gather his wheat into the barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

P: Lift up your hearts.


C: We lift them to the Lord.
