The Call to Worship

Isaiah 40:1-2 and Psalm 118:22-24

Pastor: Comfort, comfort my people, says your God.

Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that her warfare is ended,
that her iniquity is pardoned,
that she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins.

The first Easter began with hearts in deep mourning as a small group of women walked to the tomb of Jesus for their final opportunity to prepare His body for the sleep of death. His burial on Friday had been done in haste as the Passover Sabbath was quickly approaching. Now they would have the time for proper preparation of their beloved Master's body. But the solemn mood of that first Easter was broken by the fulfillment of God's promise of the resurrection of His Beloved Son, for as the Psalmist promised,

The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone.
This is the LORD's doing; it is marvelous in our eyes.
This is the day that the LORD has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it.

The Easter Gospel

Mark 16:1-6; Acts 2:22-24

Elder: When the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint [Jesus]. And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. And they were saying to one another,

Speaker: "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance of the tomb?"

Elder: And looking up, they saw that the stone had been rolled back — it was very large. And entering the tomb, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, dressed in a white robe, and they were alarmed. And he said to them, "Do not be alarmed. You seek Jesus of Nazareth, Who was crucified. He has risen; He is not here. See the place where they laid Him."

Pastor: "Men of Israel, hear these words: Jesus of Nazareth, a Man attested to you by God with mighty works and wonders and signs that God did through Him in your midst, as you yourselves know — this Jesus, delivered up according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God, you crucified and killed by the hands of lawless men. God raised Him up, loosing the pangs of death, because it was not possible for Him to be held by it.

Isaiah 65:17-25

"Behold, I create new heavens and a new earth, and the former things shall not be remembered or come into mind.
¹⁸But be glad and rejoice forever in that which I create; for behold, I create Jerusalem to be a joy, and her people to be a gladness. ¹⁹I will rejoice in Jerusalem and be glad in my people; no more shall be heard in it the sound of weeping and the cry of distress. ²⁰No more shall there be in it an infant who lives but a few days, or an old man who does not fill out his days, for the young man shall die a hundred years old, and the sinner a hundred years old shall be accursed.

The Apostles' Creed

Pastor: ..."don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death?

Who commissioned Your Church to make disciples of all nations by baptizing and teaching them,
