What we offer at Bethlehem

Readiness Skills

Within the course of a day, we provide ABC's, counting, colors, numbers and shapes along with social experiences at many levels for each individual child.

We learn through our play and do NOT use worksheets or drills. Our learning is experiential and relevant to each child.

Language Skills

We offer books, finger plays, stories, music, sharing day, pictures, writing activities, and many cooperative projects where children experience language throughout the day.

There is ample time for communicating with peers and teachers too!

Classroom Discipline

We re-direct children to follow the classroom rules for safety and order. Each child is valuable because God made them and every child is treated as a precious creation of God. We use a Time-Out chair to help redirect children if further redirection is necessary.

Fine Motor Skills

Through manipulative toys, easel painting, playdough activities, writing, cutting and other small motor activities, we help each child develop fine motor skills needed for success in a classroom setting.

Sharing God's Word with All Generations.

Parents are always welcome in our classroom.

We teach children about God at a level they understand. They learn that God loves them and gives them their families who love them.
